



Edward Turner Horticulture Futures Grant Terms & Conditions

Focus

Horticulture, Science, Business tertiary students

Level of Study

Post-graduate

Purpose

The **Edward Turner Horticulture Future Grant** ('the Grant') is a \$10,000 grant to support a research project, or further study (such as Masters, Honours, or second degree) of a post-graduate tertiary student based in Aotearoa New Zealand who intends to pursue a career in the horticulture industry (within horticulture, science or business career disciplines).

Background

T&G Global is proud to announce the third round of the Edward Turner Horticulture Futures Grant, a prestigious \$10,000 post-graduate scholarship designed to foster the next generation of horticultural leaders. This grant, named in honour of T&G's visionary founder Edward Turner, continues to support promising students advancing the future of horticulture.

Value and Tenure

The value of the grant is \$10,000 and will be awarded annually at T&G's sole discretion.

Eligibility

- Applications are open to all post-graduate tertiary students who have completed at least one tertiary-level degree in Aotearoa New Zealand.
- Applicants must be New Zealand citizens or permanent residents.
- Applicants must:
 - be enrolled to study a post-graduate qualification (within horticulture, science or business disciplines) in 2026, *or*
 - be undertaking a research project related to the horticulture industry.

Selection Criteria

Key to the selection process will be the applicant's ability to demonstrate a passion and commitment to work in the horticulture sector (all career disciplines).

Academic merit and the intended research or planned study will also be considered.

Selection Panel

The recipient of the grant will be chosen by T&G Global's appointed grant selection panel, and its decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

The grant selection panel has the right to refrain from awarding the grant in any year if there are no suitable applicants.

Terms & Conditions

- Applications open on 29 October 2025, and close on 14 November 2025, with the successful recipient announced in due course.
- Applicants must complete an application form and agree to these terms and conditions.
- Applicants must exhibit a passion for the horticulture industry and a desire to pursue a career within it.
- The grant is a \$10,000 fund to provide financial support for the recipient to take their next step in their learning/qualifications (i.e. specialisation, research project, thesis, pursuing an Honours or Masters). At T&G's discretion, the fund may be paid in instalments or as a lump sum to the recipient. Payment of the grant will be conditional upon T&G receiving confirmation of enrolment or satisfactory evidence to support the research project.
- The grant must be used for the purposes stated in the recipient's application within the year it is received.
- The successful recipient must be a New Zealand citizen or a New Zealand permanent resident.

Conditions of the Grant

The grant may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.

The successful applicant must:

- Provide updates to T&G on progress of their course of study/project in the 12 months following the grant being awarded.
- At the conclusion of the year the grant is awarded, present a summary of their work/study to T&G.
- Be involved in publicity about the award and the call for applications for the following year (including stories, speaking ops, photo/video as required within reason).
- Alert T&G if the intended study, project or reason for the funds being awarded is abandoned, cancelled or does not progress for any reason. It will be at T&G's sole discretion whether an alternate course of study or research project fits the intended purpose of the fund and the grant and funding may be withdrawn and/or may be repayable to T&G if not.
